To ensure effective and efficient governance & administration of LGPS

- Equal number employer and employee reps with voting powers (minimum 4 in total)
- An independent Chair has no vote
- Quorum? Both sides present?
- Terms of Reference? Open to Public?
- Board Secretary: key relationship with Chair
- Officials in attendance?
