The JCT suite of contracts is one of the most important documents in any building or civil engineering project, and public sector practitioners need to understand the operation of the contract. This one-day event will provide an overview of the JCT 2024 suite of contracts, (The JCT2016 will be withdrawn from 1 April 2026).

The JCT 2024 update is being hailed as significant because it introduces many of the emerging issues in the UK construction industry, (Building Safety Act 2022 and Fire Safety Act 2021). There are also notable inclusion of clauses relating to sustainable development, environmental considerations and notification and negotiation of disputes. This event will help you grasp the practical implications of the current JCT contract version as well as the changes in a public sector context.
