The 2015-17 Strategic Objectives

The 2015-17 CIPFA Midlands Development Plan focused on 3 strategic objectives

CIPFA Midlands also continued to deliver its Business as Usual activities as a Regional Council 1. We will promote and support increased recruitment levels

2. We will raise the noise level of CIPFA Midlands social media

3. We will support the retention and development of CIPFA professionals through our events programme, broadened to new NHS students



Achievements for CIPFA and CIPFA Midlands during 2015/16

- Now in its third year, the local CIPFA Apprenticeship Scheme continues to report success with permanent job awards going to the students, 9 of these in Grant Thornton, hosts of the scheme
- Continued innovation in free and low cost events at good quality venues. Topics this year included Better Care, Elearning, fraud, housing and student events aimed at soft skills and exam success. We continued the Question Time series of events and will be issuing new dates for these in 2016.
- Feedback indicates that 95% of attendees believe the events are good or excellent



There have been highs.....

- Flagship Sixth Form Management Games 7 games held across the region in 2015.
- Volunteer roles available for mentoring groups of students, marking their submissions, judging presentations and acting your socks off as trade union representatives, journalists and members!

Worth noting that since 2006, some 90 schools and colleges have provided over 200 teams at 40 games.





And lows....

- Annual seminar cancelled in 2015 due to low interest feedback indicated increasing pressures in the workplace, inadequate notice of speaker line-up
- CAATs programme requires more volunteers to assist in the planning and administration
- Any suggestions from the wider membership on topics of interest welcomed
- Can you volunteer to help with events planning?



We will promote and support increased recruitment levels

We supported growth in the CIPFA Midlands student population:

- We continue to promote the CIFPA apprentice scheme using the route of AAT and nurturing talent into permanent roles across the region
- We work with other CIPFA Regions to explore innovation and promote any innovation locally in the Midlands
- We increased opportunities for the enthusiastic students attending 6th form games and linked students to organisations
- We have ready a mentoring scheme for students and newly qualified members and will be promoting this through the student society



We will raise the noise level of CIPFA Midlands and embrace social media

We improved our events offer:

- We ran low cost and innovative events in new and accessible venues
- We increased attendance levels within our existing events programme
- We are aiming to increase the number of events held jointly with the HfMA to ensure good service for NHS students
- We ran a cross sector round table event on the Better Care fund and will continue to run a series of such events in 2016 in partnership with Grant Thornton



2016 Landscape for the CIPFA Professional

- Financial pressures, deficits, losses continue to dominate the headlines
 the grip of austerity holds tight
- The public service provision is sacrosanct to the UK citizen, NHS, police, fire, parks, bins, public health, social services, schools, job support etc, etc erosion might be inevitable but loss of service is not
- The sector will see new models of service delivery. Eg West Midlands Combined Authority, merging metropolitan areas with LEP geographies and creating larger economic structures. There is strength and sustainability in the new scale of organisation.
- Uncertainty global markets, migration crises, and the big question for June 23rd – in or out of Europe?
- Financial leadership and governance is and will continue to be crucial an entrepreneurial core will be required of our members
