#### The objectives of the game are:

- to allow players to gain an insight into the issues facing public sector organisations, particularly those of a financial nature
- to demonstrate the challenges of managing under time pressure with uncertain outcomes
- to develop team and individual skills
- to be fun and engaging
- to introduce 6<sup>th</sup> form students to public sector accountancy and CIPFA.



The game involves certain aspects of running a fictitious public body, with each sixth form providing a team of **seven** students (not 6 as last year when on-line) to form the "management team" for the organisation involved. The event is organised on a case study basis, allowing team members to participate as much as possible, as they each take up a specific role within the management team. The game is usually divided into two rounds, with the team producing a major piece of work in each round, either in the form of a written report or an oral presentation.

As in real life, work on this will be interrupted by a number of tasks and the team will need to agree the best way to deal with the interruptions.

The game tests presentational, organisation and communication skills as well as providing a small element of financial awareness, but the assessors will mark performance by the way the team handles problems, the relevance of answers, the approach taken to the tasks in hand and the quality and content of written and oral reports.

Students on Business Studies courses may particularly benefit from being involved, but the event is open to any students **aged 16 or over** at the time of the event, who are keen to develop as individuals **and who haven't taken part in the games previously**.

Teams will be supported and encouraged throughout the day by CIPFA students and members who have volunteered their time to assist with the game. Sign up soon at <u>6thForms@cipfa.org</u> as it is likely that there will only be 18 spaces this year as we venture carefully back into our in-person offer.

Please also ensure that the date is set aside in your calendars and that you have the wider support of the whole establishment - late withdrawals are unfair on students, deny other sixth forms an opportunity to take part and can result in the unnecessary waste of resources and associated cost for CIPFA.

Prizes and certificates will be provided by CIPFA, together with the game materials, stationery and a buffet lunch – there is no charge for sixth forms to take part, but they will be responsible for the team's travel arrangements to and from the



event. Sixth forms will also need to ensure that they take on board any requirement for health and safety assessments and safeguarding. We can liaise with host organisations, but we simply do not have the resources to undertake assessments for everyone.

**Each sixth form will normally only be able to enter one team**, and this shouldn't include students who have taken part in the games in previous years. Sixth Forms who



request a place should hear back within a week as to whether they have a place in the game or not. We will not consider the possibility of a second team taking part until much nearer the event when other sixth forms have had the opportunity to take up places. If there are still vacant places three weeks before the event then these may be offered to sixth forms who have expressed an interest in a second team taking part at the same event.

The sixth forms taking part will receive

briefing material prior to the event and it is important that members of the team receive, consider and understand the briefing material or they may be at a disadvantage against the other teams.

CIPFA (the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy) is one of the leading professional accountancy bodies in the UK and the only one that specialises in the public

sector. CIPFA's members work, often at the most senior levels, in public service bodies, in the national audit agencies and major accountancy firms. All the time they spend on the management team games is in a volunteer capacity

A number of our volunteers may have undergone DBS checks for other organisations, but they will not have been checked for this activity, as we do not envisage them having a need to be on their own with 6<sup>th</sup> form students.
