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

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Challenges of the NI public sector environment

- Lots of 'players on the pitch'
- Relatively high degree of regulation, audit & inspection
- Lots of uncertainties and challenges:
 - ➤ Political sensitivities
 - ➤ COVID-19 Pandemic
 - > Economic and financial pressures
 - ➤ UK Exiting the EU
 - >Analysing and securing data
 - ➤ High public expectations, demands and resource challenges



Strategic approach to efficiencies

- Manage public expectations
- Change in approach and mindset
- Invest to save preventative spending
- Eliminate duplication of services
- Consider 'opportunity costs' of spending decisions
- Review role of Department of Finance
- Emphasise role of the Accounting Officer



Operational efficiencies

- Focus on techniques that have been successful in delivering efficiency in the past
- Continually review 'back-office' efficiency.
- Introduce a simple, standardised approach to reviewing VFM & make it business as usual
- Involve managers and front-line staff in achieving VFM
